# Construction Technology TCJ 3CT/TCJ 4CT

# **Course Description/Rationale**

This course focuses on residential and light construction systems related to commercial,



industrial and/or recreational construction with a particular focus on systems related to stage production, set design and stagecraft

construction. Students will learn about the tools, materials, equipment, and methods used in the technical theatre industry; structural analysis and design; presentation working drawings; and auxiliary systems. They will also estimate materials and labour costs, study industry standards and building codes, consider health and safety issues, and energy conservation, and explore careers and the impact of technology on society and the environment. Working in groups, students will provide technical support required for annual dramatic productions and school-based assemblies.

# Communication Technology TGJ 3MT/TGJ 4MT

# **Course Description/Rationale**

This course examines stage production communication systems, design, and production processes in the areas of electronic, live, recorded, and graphic communications. Students will develop knowledge and skills relating to the



assembly, operation, maintenance, and repair of the basic and more complex components of a range of stage production communication

systems such as sound and lighting. Students will also study industry standards and regulations, health and safety issues, and will explore careers and the impact of communications technology on society and the environment. Working in groups, students will provide the technical support required for annual dramatic productions and school-based assemblies.
